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

('other auditor') whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the Consolidated Financial Statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of the subsidiary, and our report in terms of sub-sections (3) and (11) of Section 143 of the Act, in so far as it relates to the aforesaid subsidiary is based solely on the reports of the other auditor.

The Consolidated Financial Statement include the results for the half year ended March 31, 2025 being the balancing figure between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the half year ended September 30, 2024 for the Standalone Financial Statements and between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and unpublished year to date figures of the Subsidiary Company which is audited by Statutory Auditor of Subsidiary Company.
